

Who Are We?

CVRA Membership Drive

Parking and Traffic Commission Application Deadline Extended

The City Council is seeking applications from anyone interested in participating in the development of short, medium, and long term plans that address traffic and parking demands in Capitola Village. There will be 10 public member seats on the Commission and the commissioners' terms will expire on December 31, 2010. At that time, commissioners may seek reappointment for an additional two year term.

The Council will be selecting 2 village residents, 2 village business owners, 1 Pacific Cove Mobile Home Park resident, as well as each Council member will appoint one "at large" member. One member of the Planning Commission will also be selected to serve on this commission.

The Capitola City Council extended the application deadline to Wednesday, April 15, 2009. Appointments will be made on Thursday, April 23, 2009. Applications are available at City Hall or on-line.



Ever Wonder About Speed Bumps?

According to Steve Jesberg in the Public Works Department, the City currently has no plans or policy in place for the installation of speed bumps. Due to noise and emergency vehicle response issues the City has chosen not to install speed bumps on city streets at this time. This policy has been in place for at least 10 years. The only city streets with speed bumps are 45^{th} , 47^{th} , and 49^{th} in the Jewel Box, which were constructed in the 1980s. At this time the City Council would need to provide direction to staff to develop a policy that could be applied citywide.
