Great news! The design of the 230 space temporary parking lot in the lower portion of Pacific Cove has been approved by the City Council and is being put out to bid. At this point it is estimated that it will be open in time for the Begonia Festival on Labor Day weekend. These additional spaces should result in dramatically less Village overflow parking in the surrounding residential neighborhoods. Further, it will

replace the Post Office parking lot as the base for the summer beach shuttle program. This means faster turn around times for the shuttle and better utilization of the parking lot. Two thumbs up for the City.
